Fun At The Fair

We hope that most problems can be resolved locally and informally. If you have any concerns about the care you have received, it is best to sort it out straight away by speaking to a member of staff.

If the issue you wish to make is about Primary or Community Care (from your local medical centre) you can ask any member of staff to direct you to the person responsible for complaints – usually the Practice Administrator.

If you are an inpatient in a hospital, the best person to speak to is the Hospital Liaison Officer (HLO). The HLOs are fluent in English and German and can help resolve the matter, on your behalf.

If you are a hospital outpatient, you should speak to the hospital staff. We have arrangements in place for the HLO to be made aware of the complaint and take immediate action to resolve it.

Taking It Further

If you still have concerns, and feel your concerns have not been dealt with adequately, you can raise your issues in writing.

For Primary or Community Care, you should write to the Regional Group Practices Manager, BFG Health Service, JHQ Medical Centre, BFPO 40.

For Hospital care, you should to write to the Guy's and St Thomas (GSTT) Hospital Operations Manager, 3rd Floor Personalwohnheim, AKH Viersen, Hoserkirchweg 63, 41747 Viersen.

You may find the following advice helpful if you are making a formal written complaint:

Write to us as soon as possible after the event. This makes it easier for everyone involved to remember what happened, and helps us answer your complaint quickly.

Give as much information as you can, including your name, the name of the nurse or doctor caring for you, the ward name. This will ensure we can investigate your complaint more effectively. Do not forget to include your telephone number so we can contact you again and your address so a written reply can be sent to you directly.

If you are raising more than one concern, it helps to number each of the different points you are making. This will ensure we understand all of your concerns.

The last time I wrote in the Bulletin there was massive speculation and uncertainty regarding the future plans for Germany and, although there has been a lot of progress, I have to tell you that there is still no concrete plan. That is not to say that work has not been done, or that the staff in the MOD have sat back waiting for political direction, quite the opposite. The problem is that the work is largely invisible to us and while options are being examined it would be wrong to expose them to us, as many will fall by the wayside as the plan is refined.

In the same way, the final plan for Germany relies on many other moving parts, and what happens in the UK (decisions about bases) will have a direct bearing on us; we must wait for that part of the plan to become firm before we know where we are to fit in. Having said that, many of you know that only a few weeks ago a decision was made to close Celle station, once 2 RRF depart next summer. This was seen by the MOD as an opportunity to close a single unit station, and make an Infantry Regiment available for other tasks. The MOD will maintain flexibility in its planning and, rightly, will always be on the lookout for opportunities to make best use of resources in this time of austerity.

So, where does this leave us now? We are waiting for the announcement about the UK part of the re-basing plan. I don't expect a huge amount of detail concerning the Army (and especially units based in Germany) at this stage, but the announcement will nevertheless mark the start of a much anticipated move of troops from BFG. We do, however, know that the closure of Rhine Garrison remains a certainty. Although this sadly marks the end of an era, we still need good people to step up to the mark and contribute to making the Garrison a happy place to serve for the next two years. And, in closing, we should use the opportunity to celebrate in style everything good about the Garrison; the Stables Closure Beating Retreat is but one example.

You will see Defence featuring regularly in the news right now. Inevitably, there will be more announcements on all facets of our lives, linked to the Strategic Defence and Security Review.

Closest to home is redundancies for both military and civilian personnel. It is a difficult time for many, but others see it as an opportunity to start a new career. Whatever the situation, it is important to stay in touch; if you are not sure then ask your line manager.

In summary, I realise for many this is a slow process which only serves to increase the uncertainty. 



Elmpt Health Fair

Elmpt Station's gymnasium was filled with a range of healthcare professionals on July 14th to share advice with soldiers and their families. This year's fair was very much focusing on combat fitness and looking after equipment issued for operational environments.

David Jacklin an audiologist showed a film of a young soldier who wasn't keen on wearing his ear defenders and consequently his hearing suffered and he was no longer eligible for promotion. David also demonstrated the audio equipment and hearing protection that is currently being used in operations.

Advice was given on more sensitive subjects such as mental health and sexually transmitted diseases. Pete Loader was there from Bielefeld GU clinic, to give confidential support, and to off confidential Chlamydia testing. He said "Sometimes soldiers don't want to go through their medical centre. The med centres are bound by a duty of care to keep their confidentiality, but we offer something outside the med centre. We have satellite clinics that are run fortnightly in Hohne and JHQ; the timings are on posters in med centres."







VISITORS' SPONSORSHIP

All visitors to families in BFG need to be sponsored by the family with whom they are staying.

The sponsor should obtain a Visit Of A Close Relative form from their Unit Welfare Office (UWO) for each of the visitors. This form should be carried by the visitor at all times, as well as their passport during their stay in BFG. The form entitles them to come and go around the station/garrison facilities, and also to shop for non-rationed goods in NAAFI retail outlets on behalf of the sponsor.

Visitors should ensure that they take out full medical insurance and obtain an European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) before travelling, as Service Medical Centres are not mandated to provide treatment. Where possible, free urgent treatment may be carried out on a privilege basis, but visitors will not be covered if onward or specialist treatment is needed, even if they are sponsored.

The same rule applies for medication. All visitors should carry enough medication with them as some drugs and medicines are not available through Service Medical Centres.



EHIC application forms are available from post offices or online at www.ehic.org.uk. The combination of EHIC and travel insurance should cover medical treatment (including hospital treatment) and MEDEVAC if necessary. Visitors who do not have appropriate cover may be liable for all medical costs.

LOA Review Visit

The first comprehensive review of LOA since 2005 took place in July 2011, when the LOA Review Team paid a visit to Germany.

The purpose of the review was to ensure the allowance considers all relevant aspects of a service person's (and their dependants) expenditure, and to physically compare the cost of living in LOA areas across Germany with the cost of living in the UK.

All 3 separate LOA areas were reviewed; BFG Main (centred on Gutersloh), the US Zone (Ramstein) and an isolated detachement (Obertsdorf in Bavaria).

Important Message For All Those Receiving Kindergeld

All those who are receiving Kindergeld (German child benefit) or who have applied for it, should read this message very carefully.

The German office administering Kindergeld for members of BFG, the **Kindergeldkasse in Nürnberg**, have informed BFG that the number of fraudulent claims and families receiving payments in error is steadily increasing. This is not only giving members of BFG a bad name, it also holds up the speedy administration of claims from all honest applicants.

In order **not** to put the **Kindergeld payments at risk** for everybody, it is very important that you follow the rules as set out in Standing Instruction British Forces (Germany) no 3231 (known as SIBF(G) 3231). If you do not, and you receive Kindergeld in error, you run the risk of a) having to pay back the money, b) being prosecuted for fraud and c) possibly not receiving any future UK Child Benefit until the Kindergeld overpayment has been offset against the Child Benefit entitlement in UK. You should know that the **Child Benefit Office in UK and the Kindergeldkasse in Nürnberg work closely together**. **So make sure you are honest at all times and answer all questions to the best of your knowledge**.

In particular you should inform the Kindergeldkasse of:

The correct arrival date (i.e. the date when the applicant and the child or children were physically present in Germany) on the application form.

Any change of address (Annex H of SIBF(G) 3231) within BFG.

Any change in circumstances (e.g. a child attending a boarding school, losing dependent status etc). Children at boarding school are not entitled to Kindergeld and you must inform the Familienkasse as soon as possible, otherwise you may be accused of fraud!

Any change of the end-of-tour date (use Annex I of SIBF(G) 3231).

The date of leaving Germany on posting (Annex G of SIBF(G) 3231).

Please be aware that the staff at the Kindergeldkasse do not speak English on the telephone, but if you put your question in writing, keep it as simple as possible and e-mail it to them, you will receive a reply in due course (in German). Make sure that you quote your "Kindergeldnummer" as well as your name and address and the date of any letter you are replying to or have a question on. The e-mail address is: 'Familienkasse-Nuernberg@arbeitsagentur.de'.

Most of all, make sure you inform the Kindergeldkasse of all changes in your circumstances, in particular your leaving date on posting! If you need any help, contact your local HIVE or the Kindergeldkasse.

Future Ground Maintenance in BFG Married Quarters' Areas

There will be changes to the grounds maintenance arrangements in married quarters' areas across British Forces Germany (BFG), which will take effect from 08 August 2011. This is not linked in any way to the award of the Facilities Management contract to Babcock Support Services on 8 August 2011, but is a measure to bring BFG in line with the level of service provided in the UK. Against the background of severe financial pressures this change has been introduced as a cost-saving measure.

The major change will be that SFA occupants across Germany will be required to cut the grass and clear leaves in front of their house. In the UK, occupants have been required to maintain the areas in front of their own SFA for some time. As far as Rhine Garrison is concerned, with so many empty houses there was always the potential that the drawdown would have a particular impact. Therefore time has been taken to look at the problems related to drawdown in order to minimise the effect on the quality of life.

The following will probably answer the main questions that you may have:

Q As the License Holder for my SFA, what will I be required to do from 08 Aug 11?

A - The License Holder will be required to keep the garden tidy and free from weeds, with the front and back lawns and grassed areas cut, and hedges trimmed.

Q Will the grass be cut in front of empty houses?

A – Yes; the grass will be cut and leaves collected from in front of empty houses, whether they have been de-commissioned or if they remain in use.

Q What about the back gardens? The back gardens of empty houses near me have not been cut for some time.

A - The grass will be cut, leaves cleared and hedges trimmed in back gardens of houses that are empty awaiting new occupants, although this will not be done on a regular basis. Grass and hedges will not be cut or trimmed, or the leaves collected in the back gardens where the house is to be left empty until handback.

Q If the grass isn't cut regularly in a back garden then what happens when people move in?

A - Grass will be cut in back gardens before new occupants move in - they will not be expected to take on a jungle.

Q If the grass isn't going to be cut in some back gardens before the house is handed back, will the German authorities accept them?

A - The standard of gardens required on handback depends to a degree on the plans for the follow-on use. This will be discussed with the Federal Authorities prior to handback; however the likelihood is that a one-off cut will be carried out in most gardens before the houses are handed back.

Q My husband has/will deploy on operations, I have young children and I just won't be able to manage the grass and leaves myself. What am I to do?

A - As now, where a family genuinely needs help as a result of an operational deployment the grass will be cut and leaves cleared for them, both at the front of the house and in the back garden. In order for this to happen however they must report that they need help to their Unit Welfare Officer, who in turn will notify the HCSO Department.

Q Apart from the grass in front of my house there are other grassed areas near where I live such as the play parks. Surely the occupants on the estate won't have to cut those areas?

A - No. The grass, bushes and trees in the communal areas will continue to be managed, where appropriate cut, and leaves cleared by the Garrison.

It is appreciated that some will be disappointed with this change and may be concerned that the quarters areas will start to look untidy, however if everybody does their bit then there is no reason that this should be the case. If anybody does have a particular concern, or are not clear on exactly what they are required to do, then they should contact their Housing Estate Manager.

Defence Infrastructure Organisation (Germany) And Babcock Support Services GmbH



The Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) awarded the direct facilities management

contract to Babcock Support Services GmbH on 8 February 2011. Babcock will take over direct maintenance of the British Forces Estate in Germany from the In-House Team and our current sub contractors on Monday 8th August.

Babcock will focus on planned maintenance and repair and will respond to calls made to the helpdesk in addition to providing a grounds maintenance service. There is no change to higher value maintenance activity and new work which will continue to be delivered by the Host Nation.

As a result of Babcock's appointment, DIO will be able to improve upon the current high standard of estate maintenance achieved in Germany at lower cost to the MoD. The standard of service commended at the recent AFF conference in Herford will continue, with improvements such as reduced routine response times from 40 to 20 days.

Much of the effort required in making the change associated with Babcock's appointment is going on behind the scenes. Babcock has extensive experience in providing facilities management services to the Ministry of Defence and looks forward to extending this service to the British Forces Germany.

How will this affect me?

The only adjustment the estate users will need to make from 8 August 2011 is to call a different Helpdesk phone number and to note the alternative means of contacting the helpdesk set out below. In addition to this article, a leaflet drop leading up to 8th August 2011 will serve as a timely reminder of this small but important change.

Local arrangements for out of hours reporting, building custodians etc will continue as at present unless and until the Garrison notifies you to the contrary.

The facilities management Offices are due to remain where they are in both Rheindahlen and Elmpt and after 8 August 2011 will be populated by a mix of DIO and Babcock staff. The role of the Garrison Facilities Management Team will change significantly as a result of bringing Babcock into the team. In recognition of this change and to align with DIO arrangements in the UK, the facilities management staff will be known as the Site Estate Authority Team.

In the meantime please continue to report faults, in the barracks or at your married quarter, to the current Helpdesk as soon as you become aware of them and this will assist in providing a smooth transition for the Babcock team.

Had Your Ears Checked?

Pre and post deployment hearing tests


One of the important health checks soldiers need is a hearing test pre and post deployment. This is for your own protection. You may not be aware that you have a hearing problem, but it needs to be checked with a hearing test by a nurse or medic, as any additional damage caused by loud noise could **permanently damage your hearing**.

Earwax

If you are soon to be deployed, many of you will be getting a visit from a RACAL professional whose job is to take an impression of your ear to make sure the hearing protection kit provided to you is a good fit. However, for the impression to be accurate, and the hearing kit to be effective, your ears need to be clear of earwax. Therefore, it is important that you get a nurse or a medic to check your ears now, to ensure you are ready to have your hearing protection kit fitted.

Many troops who are soon to be deployed will be issued with Personal Interfaced Hearing Protection (PIHP) with the RACAL Frontier Talk Through System (linked into the Personal Role Radio) and this process is often delayed due to earwax not being cleared prior to the fitting.

Earwax is normal and has nothing to do with poor hygiene. It is produced naturally to protect the ear canal. However, some of us need help removing it,



which can be done easily and painlessly. Eardrops (in the form of olive oil) can be obtained from your QM's department or from a Medic and will normally soften the earwax and allow it to fall out naturally over a few days. Some of the more stubborn cases call for ear irrigation, which uses a flow of water to remove the wax. Never use cotton buds as this can push the wax further into your ear canal and damage your eardrum.

Stamp Out Mental Health Stigma - Army Campaign

The Army has launched a campaign called 'Don't Bottle it up' which is targeted at all serving personnel (both regular and reserve) and focuses on the stigma surrounding Mental Health. The campaign, which will run over several months, aims to reduce the stigma associated with mental ill health, signpost the support and care services already available, and to encourage personnel to seek help if they need it, formally or informally.



Symptoms -

Physical

Rapid heartbeat, headaches, tearful tired, fatigued, tightness of chest, stiff neck/shoulders, trouble sleeping (walking during the night or too early, oversleeping, trouble getting to sleep or not sleeping), upset stomach, nausea, diarrhoea, sweating or rashes.

Menta

Agitation, irritability, mood swings, nightmares, flashbacks, sadness, loss of sense of humour, poor concentration, over-worry and recurrent unpleasant thoughts or memories, easily discouraged, low self esteem, feeling useless, and suicidal thoughts.

Behavioural

Argumentative, irritable, aggressive, angry, intolerant, impatient, withdrawn, isolated, continuous avoidance, constantly on edge, excessive drinker or smoker, fast driver, no sex driver, under or over eating.







The Dog Whisperer... By Dave Mair Help Your Dog Avoid Summertime Dangers!

I am always surprised to see owners of pets that they say they adore and love, riding down the street for a 5 Mile session with pooch. Beware of the potential dangers!

Summer is here and I wanted to remind you of the importance of your pets' needs during hot weather. This month I will comment on dog summertime dangers and touch on symptoms of heat exhaustion, as well as treatments for affected dogs and preventative measures you should take.

Overheating - Overheating can become very serious during very hot weather. It is not only uncomfortable for your dog, it can lead to serious <u>health problems</u>.

Prevention: During hot weather, make sure your pet is in an area that is well-ventilated with good air flow. Supply plenty of fresh water. You can use a fan aimed on the dog's crate to create better airflow. Never take a dog out in a car on a hot day if you don't have to. Also, if your pet is outside, make sure they have adequate shade to keep out of the sun.

Symptoms: Swollen tongue, cloudy eyes, excessive panting and white or gray gums are all signs of heat exhaustion. A dog left in a car for only Five minutes can suffer heat stroke. If left untreated, the dog will die.

Treatment: If your dog is showing signs of over-heating, take the pet into a shaded area and ventilate with a fan. Run cool water over the pet, not cold water. Use a cool tub or hose to cool him down. Also run cool water over his ears since this will also help cool him down. Pay close attention to the abdomen and the area where the legs connect to the body. This will help cool the dog faster. While you are trying to cool him down, please do not offer drinking water in large amounts because this can make him vomit. Offer small amounts of water, or offer ice chips until he has cooled down enough, and then he can drink safely.

Dehydration - Dehydration can happen as a result of overheating. Be sure your dog has access to plenty of water, whether you are out playing with him or if he is alone outside while you are away.

Prevention: Be sure to hydrate your dog before exercise! Never go out between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., and stay out of the heat and sun at the height of the day. I would limit running with your dog during the heat of the day. I would also limit hiking, and throwing a ball or other toys.

Symptoms: Dehydrated dogs display a dry nose and mouth, eyes that are sunken and dry, and loose, flabby skin that doesn't snap back into place when gently tugged.

Treatment: Get the dog re-hydrated as soon as possible. Water can be used, but must be offered in small amounts at short

intervals. If a severely dehydrated dog is offered too much water, he will begin to vomit, and this can cause further dehydration. Electrolyte solutions can be used for dehydration. If you suspect severe dehydration, rush the pet to the vet.

Sunburn - Dogs can get sunburn, even though they have fur. Lighter haired pets can suffer sunburn more than darker pets.

Prevention: Pet breeds that are susceptible to cancer should be protected from sun even more since they could develop <u>cancer</u> from prolonged exposure. Sun block is recommended as a preventative, or you can use a body suit that uses fabric that blocks UV rays. You can also avoid the hours between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to help prevent your pets from becoming sunburned.

Symptoms: Signs of sunburn include redness and hair loss from ear tips, abdomen and the bridge of the nose. While most pet sunburns may be minor and heal with time, repeated exposure can lead to cancer in pets, just like people.

Treatment: Spray the area with cool water at 30 minute intervals, or use a cold compress held over the burn. Witch hazel applied every few hours will take away the heat of the burn, and skin conditioners can be used as well. You can also give your pet a bath in lukewarm water with colloidal oatmeal mixed in the water. Aloe gel can also be added; this will cool the sunburn and help it heal faster.

Prevent Summertime Dangers

Never leave your dog in an unattended car, not even for five minutes in the shade. The car can get 30-50° hotter inside within five minutes and cause heat stroke. It is against the law to leave a dog unattended in a hot car in nearly all communities.

If you have a swimming pool and your dog loves to swim, that is fine. However, don't just throw the dog in the pool; let him enter it at his own pace. If you throw him in, he can ingest pool water with chlorine in it, and that can make him sick. If you are allowing your dog to go swimming, make sure that you bathe him after his dip, so you can get all the chlorine-laced water out of his hair coat and body.
