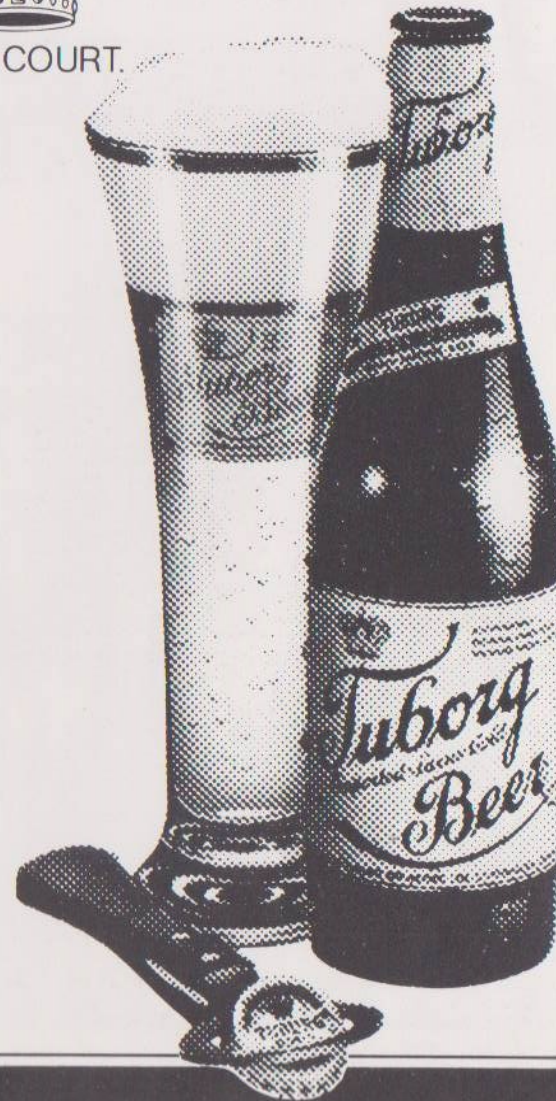

The United Kingdom Association for International Year of the Child and the British Council are jointly sponsoring a Young People's Parliament to mark the twentieth anniversary of the UN Declaration of the Rights of the Child.

The Young People's Parliament assembled on 25 and 26 October at the County Hall, Westminster thanks to the generosity of the Greater London Council.

Representatives at the Young People's Parliament were drawn from regions throughout the UK, including Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. British Forces Germany were invited to send four representatives and these were found from:

British Scouts in Western Europe	1	Neil Saunders
British Guides in Germany	1	Alison Langley
British Forces Germany Youth Service	1	Evonne Crockett

The Young People's Parliament consisted of approximately two hundred young people who would be no younger than twelve or older than seventeen on the day of assembly. The Parliament was opened by the Prime Minister, Mrs Margaret Thatcher at 1600 hrs on 25 October 1979.

One of the fundamental aims of International Year of the Child is to involve young people themselves in activities which will enhance their awareness of the underlying issues. The subject before 'Parliament' was:

"This House believes in the continued need to strive for the principles in the UN Declaration of the Rights of the Child."

The representatives from BFG travelled to UK on Wednesday 24th October and returned on Saturday 27th October. While in London they were accommodated at the 'Y' Hotel. Throughout the visit to London they were under the guidance of Anne Armstrong (of SOLDIER Magazine/SOLDIER News) and Mr M Garlick, Youth Service Officer, 2 Armd Div.

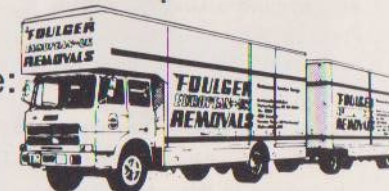

The Supercooks Column

Soup need not be boring and can constitute a marvellous start to a winter meal. Always make sure to use first class ingredients, especially when you make vegetable soups.

As my first choice I will give a cream of mussel soup, borrowed from one of the most famous restaurants of Paris; "Maxim's". Then, very much a personal choice: Pumpkin soup: People either adore it or hate it! We love it and I have two enormous pumpkins waiting in the cellar as a whole one will keep for months.

Another soup, which is a delicious standby throughout the year for deep-freeze owners is "Watercress Soup". (Wash and dry the watercress, chop it and cook it in butter until well reduced, put it in containers and deep freeze until wanted.)

As a final choice for this month I have a very simple but satisfying soup: "Potage au Gruyere": a great favourite of my children.

POTAGE BILLI BI

(for 4 people)

1 kg (2 lbs) large mussels, tightly closed
2 medium onions, finely chopped
sprigs of parsley
1 small stick of celery
crushed peppercorns
1 wineglass of very dry white wine
1/4 litre (1/2 pint) fish stock (made from fish trimmings)
1/4 litre (1/2 pint) double cream
1 egg yolk

Put the mussels, onion, parsley, celery and peppercorns in a pan. Pour over the white wine and the stock, cover and place over a lively heat. Shake the pan, keeping the lid on until the mussels open. Cook for 5 to 6 minutes and then remove the shells while keeping the mussels hot. Strain the liquid through a very fine cloth to eliminate any trace of sand and reduce it by half.

Beat egg yolk and cream, add to the liquid and bring to boiling point, stirring continuously with a wooden spoon. (Do not let it boil or it will separate). Taste and adjust the seasonings.

Serve very hot in individual soup bowls on top of reserved mussels. Sprinkle each dish with finely chopped parsley or chives.

CREME DE POTIRON

(for 6 people)

1 1/2 kg (3 lbs) pumpkin
1 litre (2 pints) milk
30 gms (1 oz) butter
pepper, salt, sugar to taste

Peel the hard outer skin of the pumpkin, remove the pips and fibrous centre part, cut flesh in to dices, put in a pan and cover with cold water. Cook for about 20 minutes with salt and pepper. When the pieces are soft, drain most of the water away. Pulp with a potato masher and add the milk. Cook gently for a further 10 minutes and then liquidize thoroughly to give a creamy consistency. Season with salt, pepper and mostly sugar (one cannot give quantities as it is very much a question of taste).

POTAGE AU CRESSON

(for 6 people)

1 bunch fresh watercress or deepfrozen
4 potatoes
1 oz (30 gms) butter
salt & pepper

Wash and dry the watercress. Put it in a pan, chopped with butter and let it reduce for a few minutes. Peel and slice potatoes. Put potatoes and cress in a pan with 1 1/2 litre (3 pints) of salted water and cook for half an hour.

Liquidise thoroughly and check seasonings. Add some fresh cream just before serving.

POTAGE AU GRUYERE

(for 6 people)

3 or 4 large potatoes.
(Potato quantity should be greater than onions)
3 large onions
200 gms (6 ozs) grated gruyere cheese

Peel and dice the potatoes, peel and slice the onions. — Cook in salted water for a good 30 minutes. — Add the grated cheese and continue cooking for a further 10 minutes. Liquidise thoroughly. Adjust seasonings.

It is better that this soup is made a bit thick initially as one can always thin it with milk if necessary.

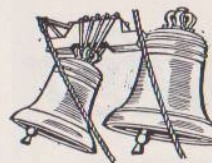

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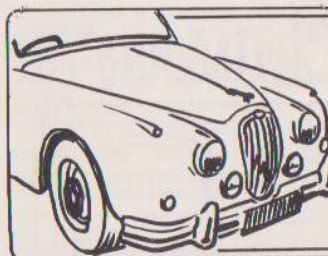

WINTER DRIVING

Winter conjures up a picture of fog, snow and ice and it is a wise driver who realizes that some very important precautions can be taken before the journey starts.

Conscious of his responsibilities to his passengers and other road users, the thoughtful driver ensures that his car has first class tyres at the correct pressure, all windows are clean, mirrors properly adjusted, windscreen wipers and washers are working, heater is serviceable and that all lights are working, including brake lights

Once on the move, anticipation and concentration are the order of the day. Anticipation? Yes! This helps you to avoid last minute emergency action that under winter conditions can be disastrous. Anticipation permits a driver to plan his actions well ahead and reduces the chances of being placed in a traffic situation that calls for harsh braking and violent steering movements. Remember, you may be on BLACK ICE!

Concentration on your task enables you to foresee hazards ahead and your subsequent positive, but unhurried actions enables the driver behind you to follow your example, and avoid colliding with your rear end! — THINK AHEAD!

As you drive along make sure your car is properly ventilated and the windows are mist free. Vision is No 1 priority. Dipped headlamps **must** be used in fog, mist or falling snow. When driving for long periods in falling snow, stop periodically and clean your headlamp and rear light glasses. SEE AND BE SEEN!

Learn to recognise warning roadsigns by their shape, — they may covered in snow and unreadable. Beware also of icy road patches, often encountered where trees shade the road and on bridges where cold winds blow under the road surface, — a common feature on autobahns.

Finally, when you are walking, don't forget your problems as a driver. Other drivers about you have the same ones, and will appreciate your help and consideration if you keep on the pavement and use official pedestrian crossings. When there is no pavement, walk **against** the traffic and in gloomy conditions wear or carry something white.

1ST RHEINDAHLEN SCOUT GROUP

The highlight of October must be the District Annual 5-a-side Football Competition.

Over 100 screaming Cubs and around 50 cheering parents filled the sports hall in Queens School on Sun 7th October. Teams represented all the eight Packs of the District in a mini World Cup style tournament. Cub Leaders refereed and to ensure fairness they were not allowed to referee any match in which their own Pack was involved. Winners of Group A were Wickrath Leopards with 4 points from their 3 games. In the first Semi-final they met Rheindahlen Kestrels, runners-up from Group B, and after a 0-0 draw the Kestrels emerged winners on penalties 4-3. The high scoring Rheindahlen Kondors, who won all of their three matches in Group B, had little difficulty in defeating the runners-up from Group A, Mönchengladbach Tigers, 2-0 in the second Semi-final. The Final proved to be real nail biting stuff with the play swinging from end to end. Again the Kondors showed they were the better side but could not get the ball past the Kestrels goalie, Simon Lovegrove, who not only resembled Gordon Banks in build, but demonstrated the great man's acrobatic skills with numerous first class saves. In fact, apart from the penalties in the Semi-final, the Kestrels conceded just one goal all afternoon. The deciding goal came in extra time after a 0-0 scoreline at the end of normal time. Mark Wood playing on the Kestrels right wing floated a pass-come-shot over the Kondor goalkeeper to give victory to the Kestrels 1-0. The Assistant District Commissioner (Cubs) presented the Trophy to the Kestrels but the real winners were the spectators who were treated to three hours of non-stop entertaining football of high quality for under 11 years olds.

The whole District expresses sincere thanks to Queens School for the use of its magnificent sports hall.

During the weekend 5th/7th October leaders and scouts from Gold Troop played host to 20 leaders and scouts from the DPSG Windberg at a camp on Wegberg Airstrip. The camp was to reciprocate the hospitality and friendship given when Gold Troop camped at Windberg in September.

The centre of attraction on the campsite was the 15 m flagpole flying the British and German national and scout flags. Two pioneering projects were completed over the weekend — a Haymakers Bridge (which did not prevent at least once person getting wet) and an Aerial Runway. Various games were played with the 2 Troops completely intermingled. The food was traditionally British with Stew & Dumplings, Sausage & Mash, Apple Pie & Cream and, of course, Bacon & Egg for breakfast. A camp fire was held on Saturday night and on Sunday afternoon a short Scouts Own Service was conducted by the District Chaplain (Padre Malcolm Jones).

As Halloween this year fell on a Pack & Troop night the Harrier Pack held a Halloween Party whilst Gold Troop & Blue Troop combined to hold a Halloween Wide Game.

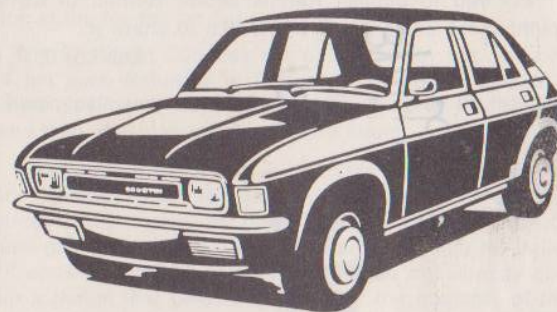


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Dear Editors

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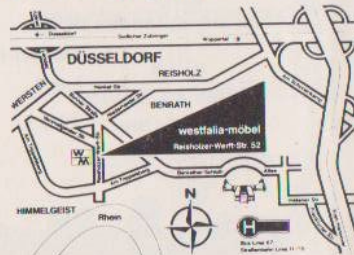

Most months in this article I refer to a member of the staff at the Shopping Complex and their specialist roll in the operation. This month one of the busiest people will be Bert Hughes, the official in charge of the Foodhall. The volume of Christmas goods is at its peak, and the full range will be completed this month with the arrival of nuts in shells, and, later on, the turkeys and poultry. Shopping on a self service basis can be very impersonal, but Mr Hughes and his staff are only too pleased to give help and advice. Bert has been at Rheindahlen for four years and is well known to many customers. Amongst other things he is quite an expert on wines, so if you are unsure, have a word with him. From time to time there are problems with supplies caused, for example, by industrial disputes and transport problems. On these occasions Mr Hughes and his staff can offer suggestions as regards suitable alternative items.

Mentioning turkeys — the full size range will be on open sale and they will be the American brand, which are excellent value and over recent years have proved to be very popular with

our customers. At the time of writing this article the price has not been fixed but it will be very competitive, you may be sure.

The toy fair is in full swing in the marquee at the back of the complex. A large range of toys, dolls, train and car racing sets, games and books are available. There are eight lines on special offer, these include a singing doll that is 16ins high and has a repertoire of twenty songs, an easily assembled "Sharna Army Helicopter and pilot" at DM 32.50 and a "three channel" remote control Lancia Stratos car at DM 105.00. For boys of all ages there are Lima train sets (which are also being demonstrated), whilst for younger children Father Christmas will be in his igloo at the toy fair on Saturdays in December.

The Shopping Complex, including the toy fair, will be open until 4 pm each Saturday in December before Christmas. There will be no closure for lunch on those days, so why not spread the load and take advantage of these extra hours.

Finally a few reminders — The Star Buy programme started on 29th October. There is a large display in the Gift & Durables department and copies of the Christmas Shopping Guide are available giving full details. The Gift Parcel scheme for delivery in the UK ends on 19th November. If you have not already done so, pick up a leaflet that gives full details of the contents of the parcels including the Special Christmas 'Wine Pack' at £6.70 — An ideal Christmas gift.

NON-FICTION

The Cruellest Night — Germany's Dunkirk and the sinking of the Wilhelm Gustloff by Christopher Dobson, John Miller & Ronald Payne.

This book tells of a great sea tragedy. When sea disasters are mentioned the names that inevitably come to mind are "Titanic" and "Lusitania", yet about 7000 people or nearly five times as many as went down in the Titanic perished when the Gustloff was torpedoed, by a Russian submarine, in the icy waters of the Baltic on a January night in 1945.

The Mountbattens — from Battenberg to Windsor by Douglas Liversidge.

The author traces the turbulent history of the rise to power of one of the most colourful and talented families of Europe.

The Days of my Freedom by Grace Griffiths is an insight into country life in the early 1920's.

The author spent the first ten years of her life with her parents in a farm cottage on the edge of Dartmoor. Her book is fascinating reading with a glimpse of lost characters and of a way of life that has disappeared.

The Complete Jogger by Bruce Tulloh.

Jogging is for everyone — young and old, fit and unfit — for all the family. This book shows how to control weight, avoid heart disease and high blood pressure, to improve the circulation and to feel really healthy.

J.P.R. — The autobiography of J P R Williams.

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You should remember the old salesman's adage "a foot in the door is worth two on the step" and be careful not to admit or invite anyone into your home. Tricks sometimes used to gain admission include (amongst others) requests to participate in a survey, to take part in some kind of competition, a free trial or some other form of incentive.

All traders at JHQ Rheindahlen are required to be in possession of both a trader's licence issued by Stadt Mönchengladbach and also a further Tradesman's Pass issued by Rheindahlen Garrison. Any civilian trader calling at your home should be asked to produce both these documents and if not in possession of them the matter should be reported to JHQ Police Station extension 4000.

VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED TO SAVE LIVES!!!

Throughout British Forces Germany there appears to be a steady increase in the number of motor cycle and moped owners, a large proportion of which are young servicemen, servicewomen and dependants. It is also apparent that the accident rate in relationship to miles covered and population is generally higher than that relating to car owners.

It has been suggested that the provision of a motor cycle/moped training organisation in the Garrison and Station would be a valuable amenity which would also contribute to road safety. The formation of such an organisation, which would have to be run as a club, would, of course, depend to a large extent upon volunteers willing to give up their spare time — there would be a need for driving and maintenance instructors, qualified testers, etc, and last but not least, administrators — particularly a President, Secretary and Treasurer.

It would be appreciated if any person willing to volunteer to help organise and operate such a club, or anyone who would wish to become a member once it was formed, could contact the Superintending Clerk, HQ Rheindahlen Garrison. A note would be preferred but a telephone call to RA 2561 would suffice.

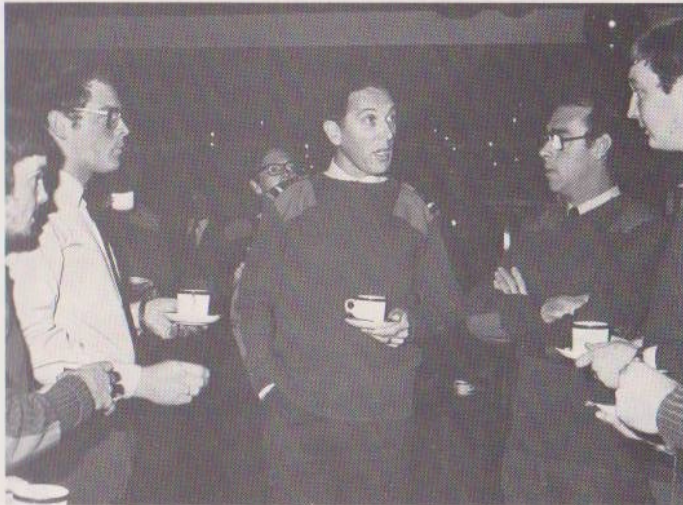

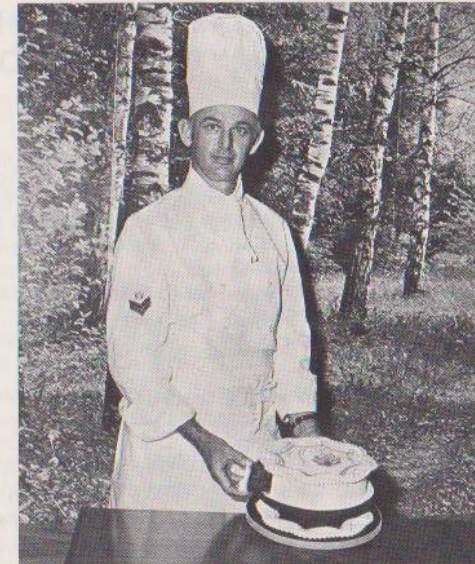

FUN WITH PLANTS FOR CHILDREN

Carrot; Beetroot; Turnip; Parsnip

These are fun to grow and quickly produce results. Cut the top inch from the vegetables and stand them in a large saucer, cut side down, and keep it topped up, with fresh water. Beetroot leaves are very attractive: a rich glossy green with red veins in the leaves.

Marrow; Melon; Pumpkins.

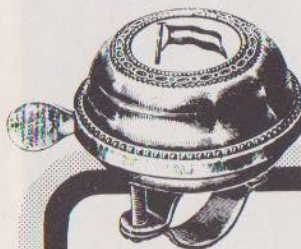
All these vegetables have seeds in the centre. Collect the seeds from only ripe or over ripe fruits. Dry them and sow them in a seed mixture (obtainable from the Garrison Nursery) and keep quite warm. They can also be started on moist blotting paper kept warm, but do not allow to dry out. Once the seeds have germinated they can be carefully transferred to a potting mixture and as the shoots grow they can be trained up bamboo sticks. If sown in the spring time and grown through the summer they may produce fruit, so save some seeds for the spring after the winter sowing.

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The Birds in your Garden

Two migrants which can be seen on the Garrison in the winter months are the Redwing (Rotdrossel) and Fieldfare (Wacholderdrossel). Both are members of the Thrush (Drosseln) family which breed in the northern areas of Europe and migrate southwards for the winter.

The Fieldfare is one of the larger thrushes and has a grey head and rump, darker tail, chestnut-brown back and spotted underside. They are often seen in large flocks in fields and open areas, sometimes accompanied by Redwings. The prominent eye-stripe, speckled underside, red underwing patches and smaller size make the Redwing easily distinguishable.

Other members of the thrush family seen here are the Mistle thrush (Misteldrossel), Song thrush (Singdrossel) and the ubiquitous Blackbird (Amsel). The Song thrush becomes scarce on the Garrison in winter as Rheindahlen appears to be on the north eastern limit of its winter range, while the Mistle thrush remains all the year round.

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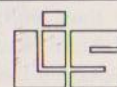
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DON'T JUST LIE THERE, SAY SOMETHING!
